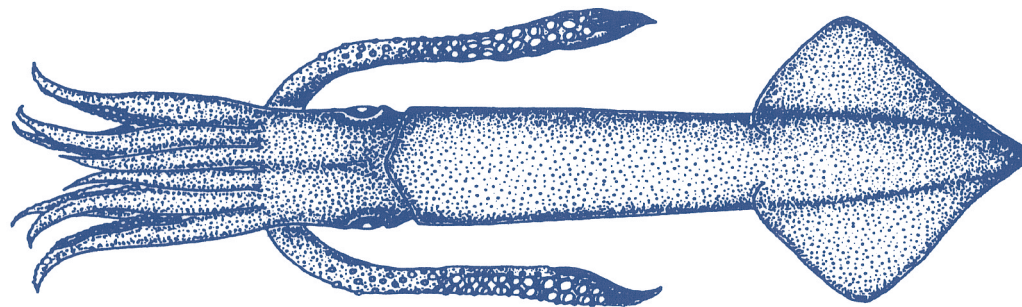

GENERAL INFORMATION

Important Information

All Logbook information must be completed on a daily basis and details for the last day of the trip must be completed before the boat docks at the conclusion of each trip.

This logbook must account for every day that your Fishing Concession is in force, regardless of whether or not you fish on that day (see “How to Complete the Squid Jigging Daily Fishing Log SQ05” on the next page).

This logbook must remain within a 50 metre radius of the boat nominated on the front of the logbook and must be aboard the boat during squid jigging operations.

Fisheries Regulations

Under Regulation 32 of the *Fisheries Management Regulations*, the Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) has determined that this logbook must be completed by all boats entitled to jig for squid in the area of the Southern Squid Jig Fishery.

Purpose

This logbook is designed for use when jigging for squid in the area of the Southern Squid Jig Fishery. It must provide a continuous record of squid jigging operations by Commonwealth permit holders in specified waters.

Accurate data collected in this logbook is essential to provide information for research into and management of Australian squid fisheries, particularly the Southern Squid Fishery.

Who should use this Logbook?

The **Concession Holder or Authorised Person** is responsible for completing the logbook at the end of each day and for certifying that the information contained in the logbook is complete and correct. An **Authorised Person** is the Master of the vessel nominated on the front of this logbook or another person authorised to act on behalf of the Concession Holder.

Confidentiality

The information contained in this logbook is CONFIDENTIAL. Any person who reveals your information to another person is subject to prosecution under the *Fisheries Management Regulations*, unless that information:

- (a) has been compiled with other information for statistical purposes in a form that does not identify you; or
- (b) is revealed in the performance of a duty under the *Fisheries Management Act 1991*; or
- (c) is revealed by the order of a court.

Penalties

Persons failing to complete and submit logbook returns in accordance with the requirements of this logbook, or giving false or misleading information in it may be liable for fines of up to \$27,500 or imprisonment for up to 12 months.

Please complete and submit this second form if any major boat and/or gear details or Skipper/Master contact details have changed.

HOW TO COMPLETE

Completing the Daily Log Page

The Daily Log can be divided into sections as follows:

PAGE HEADER

Enter the Boat Name and Distinguishing Symbols here.

NON-FISHING PERIOD

If you are not fishing for an extended period during the month, please specify the **non-fishing dates** and the **non-fishing code** in the appropriate section of the log sheet. This will reduce the number of log sheets needed to account for every day your fishing concession is valid.

FISHING DETAILS

Complete the **Date** of the drift/ set. Use a **new line for each drift** if there is more than one drift on a particular day. Record details of every drift even if you do not catch anything.

For any days on which you do not fish, start a new line on the log sheet and write the date and the relevant numeric **Non-Fishing Code** in the shaded column.

Start Drift Latitude and **Start Drift Longitude** are the starting positions when jigging for the drift is commenced and should be recorded in degrees and minutes.

Sea Surface Temperature – enter at the start of the drift in degrees Celsius.

Average Depth of Seabed – tick metres or fathoms and indicate the average depth fished during the drift.

Total Number of Lures Used – record the total number of lures used in each drift.

Hours Fished- is the total number of hours spent jigging for each drift.

Specify the total estimated **Catch** in kilograms of **Arrow Squid** and specify the species and total estimated catch in kilograms of **Other Species** for each drift.

Discards - specify the species and estimated weight in kilograms of all species discarded (ie. not retained) during the jigging operation.

Interrupted Fishing Operation Code - If your fishing is interrupted (delayed or cut short) during a trip, record the corresponding letter code in the shaded column and provide details in the comments box.

Enter the name of the **Port of Landing**.

WILDLIFE AND OTHER PROTECTED SPECIES

Please indicate for each drift whether or not your fishing gear came into contact with/or caught a protected marine species by ticking the appropriate box. A list of protected marine species is provided on the underside of the foldout flap. If you tick the **Yes box**, please record the details on the '**Wildlife and Other Protected Species Form**' located at the back of the logbook and submit with the corresponding log pages to AFMA. The following are instructions for recording the interaction details on the **Wildlife and Other Protected Species Form:**
Species Name – Record the common name of the animal encountered, with one line for each individual (refer to the Wildlife and Other Protected Species List on the inside of the foldout flap).

Time – Record the estimated time at which the interaction occurred.

Position – Specify the location of the interaction by Latitude and Longitude in degrees and minutes.

Caught During Fishing Operation – Tick the estimated stage of the fishing operation at which the interaction occurred. If 'other' is ticked please provide details in the Comments box.

Hooked or Entangled – Tick the appropriate box.

Band or Tag Number – Record the band or tag number if one was found.

Life Status – Tick the condition or life status of the animal at the time of release.

Comments – Please indicate where in the gear the animal was entangled/caught, how it was released and any other details of the interaction that you believe to be important. For example: female, adult, juvenile, etc.

COMMENTS

Please record any details on gear loss, broken machines/gear for each drift, whether you had an extended fishing trip (more than one night's fishing before landing catch), observations on the size of the squid, weather, temperature, currents, or fish behaviour that may be of interest to scientific researchers as well as seals or sharks affecting your catch (ie. squid loss to bite-offs).

SIGNATURE BOX

The **Concession Holder/ Authorised Person Signature, Date and Printed Name** must be entered on every log page. The signature verifies the information recorded in the logbook is an accurate record of the fishing operation.

TIME BOX

Please provide an estimate of the total time taken to complete each log page. All Commonwealth Departments are required to have time boxes included on their forms. This initiative forms a part of the Government's regulatory reform strategy to reduce the paperwork and compliance burden on business.

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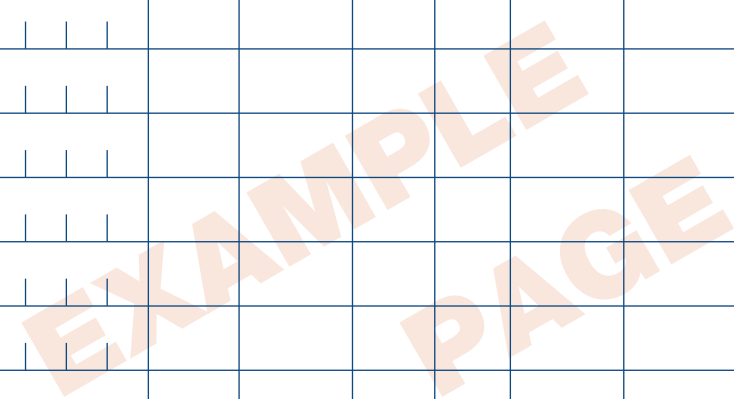
